THE BIG THREE

At a minimum these topics should be delivered in all Fire Prevention activities and should be covered based upon the audience.



Smoke Alarms – Installed and inspected. Home exit plans are created and practiced.



Fire Extinguishers – Go over use, inspection and storage. Attempt to extinguish if fire is small and still call Fire Department.



Call 911 – Some people are afraid to call for the Fire Department. Explain that it is ok to call. It is also ok to call non-emergency if they have questions, as well.
